

## Q4 Has your institution instituted any delay in operations such as a delay in return from Spring Break, closures, etc.






### Q6 How will delay in operations impact pay for staff (check all that apply):

This impacts our grant because prior to this closure, SISD Community Education had notified PT instructors that April 30th would be their last day. ## Q7 Do you anticipate administrative disruptions that would impact TWC financial (CDER) / performance reporting (TEAMS)?






